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

# Our prophet Muhammad (peace be upon him)


UR prophet Muhammad (peace be upon him) was born in the month of Rabi' al-awwal in 570. He belonged to the Banu Hashim, one of the prominent families of Mecca, although it seems not to have been prosperous during Muhammad's early lifetime.[14][42] Tradition places the year of Muhammad's birth as corresponding with the Year of the Elephant, which is named after the failed destruction of Mecca that year by the Aksumite king Abraha who had in his army a number of elephants. Recent scholarship has suggested alternative dates for this event, such as 568 or 569.[43]

Our prophet Muhammad's (peace be upon him) father, Abdullah, died almost six months before he was born. [44] Soon after Muhammad's (peace be upon him) birth he was sent to live with a Bedouin family in the desert, as the desert-life was considered healthier for infants. Muhammad (peace be upon him) stayed with his foster-mother, Halimah bint Abi Dhuayb, and her husband until he was two years old. Some western scholars of Islam have rejected the historicity of this tradition. [45] At the age

of six Muhammad (peace be upon him) lost his mother Amina to illness and he became fully orphaned.[46] He was subsequently brought up for two years under the quardianship of his paternal grandfather Abd al-Muttalib, of the Banu Hashim clan of the Quravsh tribe. When Muhammad (peace be upon him) was eight. his grandfather also died. He now came under the care of his uncle Abu Talib. the new leader of Banu Hashim.[43] According to Watt, because of the general disregard of the quardians in taking care of weak members of the tribes in Mecca in sixth century, "Muhammad's (peace be upon him) guardians saw that he did not starve to death, but it was hard for them to do more for him, especially as the fortunes of the clan of Hashim seem to have been declining at that time."[47]

While still in his teens, Muhammad (peace be upon him) accompanied his uncle on trading journeys to Syria gaining experience in the commercial trade. When Our Prophet Muhammad (peace be upon him) was either nine or twelve while accompanying the Meccans' caravan to Syria, he met a Christian monk or hermit named Bahira who is said to have foreseen Muhammed's (peace be upon him) career as a prophet of God.[48]

It was his practice to retire often to a cave in the desert for meditation. His place of retreat was Hira', a cave in a mountain called the Mountain of Light not far from Makkah, and his chosen month was Ramadan, the month of heat. It was

there one night toward the end of his quiet month that the first revelation came to him when he was forty years old.

He heard a voice say: "Read!" He said: "I cannot read." The voice again said: "Read!" He said: "I cannot read." A third time the voice, commanded: "Read!" He said: "What can I read?" The voice said:

"Read: In the name of thy Lord Who createth.

their eschatological punishment (Qur'an 38:70. Qur'an 6:19). Sometimes the Qur'an does not explicitly refer to the Judgment day but provides examples from the history of some extinct communities and warns Muhammad's (peace be upon him) contemporaries of similar calamities (Qur'an 41:13-16). [58] Muhammad (peace be upon him) is not only a warner to those who reject God's revelation, but also a bearer of good news for those who abandon evil. listen to the divine word and serve God [59] Muhammad's (peace be upon him) mission also involves preaching monotheism: The Qur'an demands Muhammad (peace be upon him) to proclaim and praise the name of his Lord and instructs him not to worship idols apart from God or associate other deities with God.[58]

The key themes of the early Qur'anic verses included the responsibility of man towards his creator; the resurrection of dead, God's final judgment followed by vivid descriptions of the tortures in hell and pleasures in Paradise; and the signs of God in all aspects of life. Religious duties required of the believers at this time were few: belief in God, asking for forgiveness of sins, offering frequent prayers, assisting others particularly those in need, rejecting cheating and the love of wealth (considered to be significant in the commercial life of Mecca), being chaste and not to kill newhorn girls [141]



# The Hijrah from Makkah to Yathrib (Madinah), (June 20th, 622 C.E.)


The last of the able Muslims to remain in Makkah were Abu Bakr, Ali and the Prophet Mohammed (peace be upon him) himself. Abu Bakr, a man of wealth, had bought two riding camels and retained a guide in readiness for the flight. The Prophet (peace be upon him) only waited for God's command. It came at last. It was the night appointed for his murder. The slavers were before his house. He gave his cloak to Ali, bidding him lie down on the bed so that anyone looking in might think Muhammad (peace be upon him) lay there. The slavers were to strike him as he came out of the house, whether in the night or early morning. He knew they would not injure Ali. Then he left the house and, it is said, blindness fell upon the would-be murderers so that he put dust on their heads as he passed bywithout their knowing it.

## The Hijrah counts as the beginning of the Muslim era

He went to Abu Bakr's house and called to him, and they two went together to a cavern in the desert hill and hid there till the hue and cry was past, Abu Bakr's son and daughter and his herdsman bringing them food and tidings after nightfall. Once a search party came quite near them in their hiding-place, and Abu Bakr was afraid; but the Prophet said: "Fear not! Allah is with us." Then, when the coast was clear, Abu Bakr had the riding-camels and the guide brought to the cave one night, and they set out on the long ride to Yathrib.

After traveling for many days of unfrequented paths, the fugitives reached a suburb of Yathrib, whither, for weeks past, the people of the city had been going every morning, watching for the Prophet till the heat drove them to shelter. The travelers arrived in the heat of the day, after the watchers had retired. It was a Jew who called out to the Muslims in derisive tones that he whom they expected had at last arrived.

Such was the Hijrah, the Flight from Makkah to Yathrib, which counts as the beginning of the Muslim era. The thirteen years of humiliation, of persecution, of seeming failure, of prophecy still unfulfilled, were over.
